FLOWERS AND PLANTS REGULATIONS

1. Exhibitors must ensure that their flower or plant is entered in the correct class as transfers are not permitted.
2. Each entry must be the work of the individual exhibitor.
3. Flowers and plants which has been accepted for exhibition at a previous Stroud Show will not be eligible.
4. All flowers and plants must be have been grown within 12 months prior to the first day of the Stroud Show.
5. Flowers and plants can only be entered once per category.
6. Entries must not have names identifying the exhibitor.
7. All exhibits to be in glass jars provided by Stroud Show for Classes 8010, 8011,8012, 8013, 8015, 8016, 8017, 8018, 8019, 8020 and 8023. Exhibitors must provide their own vase, plate or pot for all other Classes.
8. Flowers and plants must remain on display until 2pm on the Sunday of the show.
9. Judges decision is final.
10. Entries close the Thursday before the show at 10am.
11. All entries must be delivered to the "Secretaries Office" before 11am, the Thursday before the show, during the Secretaries Office hours. Secretaries Office hours are displayed on the Stroud Show website.
12. Entries must be delivered with entry tags.
13. "The Produce Pavilion" will close at 2pm on the Sunday of the show to begin the removal of displays for collection.
14. Entries can be collected between 3pm and 4pm on the Sunday of the show from "The Produce Pavilion".
15. Flowers and plants may be photographed for promotional purposes in relation to the Stroud Show.
